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### QUESTION 1

Which of the following statements are correct about a gradient? Each correct answer represents a complete solution. Choose all that apply.

- A. Gradients cannot include mixed ink colors using any color mode.

Correct Answer: BD

A gradient is a graduated blend between two or more colors or between two tints of the same color. Gradients can include paper, process colors, spot colors, or mixed ink colors using any color mode. They are defined by a series of color stops in the gradient bar. A gradient changes from one color to the next at a point called stop, and is identified by a color square under the gradient bar. It starts with two colors and a midpoint at 50%, by default.

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### QUESTION 2

Which of the following methods will you use to import XML tags and XML contents from an XML file?

- A. In the Tags panel, choose the Map Tags to Styles option in the panel's flyout menu.
- B. In the Tags panel, choose the Load Tags option in the panel's flyout menu.
- C. In the Tags panel, choose the Map Styles to Tags menu option in the panel's flyout menu.
- D. File > Import XML.

Correct Answer: D

Choose File > Import XML, which imports not only XML tags but also XML contents from an XML file. This process works in two ways. If a document has no content, importing an XML file adds XML tags to the Tags panel and into the Structure panel of the document . It also adds the content to the Structure panel where you can click and drag it into InDesign frames in the layout. If a document has some content, importing an XML file brings in the content to your document

and places it in frames in your document that have the same tags already applied.

Answer: B is incorrect. In the Tags panel, you choose the Load Tags option in the panel's flyout menu to import tags from an XML file or an InDesign document that has tags defined in it.

Answer: A is incorrect. If you choose Map Tags to Styles, it will tell InDesign which XML tag to substitute for a specified character or paragraph style during the XML export.

Answer: C is incorrect. If you choose Map Styles to Tags, it will tell InDesign to immediately replace the specified styles with XML tags.

### QUESTION 3

Which of the following actions needs to be taken if the text flows from page to page in a multipage document?

- A. Select the Facing Pages option.
- B. Click the Potrait iconic button.
- C. Select the Master Text Frame option.
- D. Click the Landscape iconic button.

Correct Answer: C

Following are the steps to create a new document:

1. Choose the sequence File>New>Document or press CTRL+N.
  2. Choose Print or Web in the Internet pop-up menu according to the type of document to be created.
  3. Type the number in the Number of Pages field, if the number of pages in the publication is exactly known.
  4. Enter the number in the Start Page # field on which the document is to be started, if it is other than 1.
  5. If a multipage publication having a spine, such as a book, catalog, or magazine is to be created, then select the Facing Pages option.
  6. Select the Master Text Frame option, if the text needs to flow from page to page in a multipage document, such as a book or a catalog.
  7. One of the pre-defined sizes from the pop-up menu can be chosen in the Page Size area.
  8. Click the Potrait or Landscape iconic button to set the page orientation.
  9. To specify the number of columns in pages, type a value in the Columns field.
  10. In the Gutter field, specify a gutter distance.
  11. In the Margins area, specify margin values.
  12. The Bleed and Slug area of the New Document dialog box will appear on clicking More Options, and the More Options button will be changed to Fewer Options.
  13. To close the New Document dialog box, click the OK button.

### QUESTION 4

Correct Answer: C

The Create PDF Bookmarks option should be selected if you want the table of contents entries to appear in the Bookmarks panel of Adobe Acrobat or Adobe Reader when the document is exported to PDF.

Answer: D is incorrect. The Include Text On Hidden Layers option should be selected if you want the paragraphs on hidden layers to be included in your table of contents.

Answer: B is incorrect. The Sort Entries in Alphabetical Order option is selected to sort table of contents entries in the selected style alphabetically.

Answer: A is incorrect. The Between Entry And Number option should be selected to specify which characters you want between the table of contents entry and its page number.

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#### QUESTION 5

Which of the following tools can be used to create straight lines?

Correct Answer: D

Following are the various objects that can be created with InDesign's object-creation tools.

  4. Basic frames created by using Ellipse Frame, Rectangle Frame, and Polygon Frame




Correct Answer: C

When you are creating a hyperlink to a Webpage, the URL option will be specified in the 'Link To' menu as the hyperlink destination. When a user is creating a hyperlink to a webpage the following steps should be followed:

- 1.Select the text, frame, or graphic that needs to be the hyperlink's source.
- 2.Choose Window>Interactive>Hyperlink to open the Hyperlink panel.
- 3.In the URL text box of the Hyperlink panel, type or paste the URL name (such as <http://www.company.com>) which you want to use as hyperlink destination.
- 4.Choose New Hyperlink from the Hyperlinks panel.



5. Choose URL from the Link To menu, specify appearance options, and click OK.



Answer: B is incorrect. Specify the Email option in the \\Link To\\ menu to create a hyperlink destination to an email. If a user wants to create hyperlink to an email message then following steps should be follow:

1. Select the text, frame, or graphic which a user wants to be the source of the hyperlink.
2. Choose New Hyperlink in the Hyperlinks panel menu, or click the Create New Hyperlink button at the bottom of the Hyperlinks panel.
3. In the New Hyperlink dialog box, choose Email from the Link To menu.

4. For Address, type the email address, such as andrew@yahoo.com.

5. For Subject Line, type the text that appears in the subject line of the email message.

6. Select Shared Hyperlink Destination if the email message needs to be stored in the Hyperlinks panel for easy reuse.


7. Specify the appearance of the hyperlink source as per requirement, and then click OK.

Answer: A is incorrect. Specify the Shared Destination option in the '\\Link To\\' menu to create a hyperlink destination to a shared destination.

1. Select the text, frame, or graphic which a user wants to be the source of the hyperlink.

2. Choose New Hyperlink in the Hyperlinks panel menu, or click the Create New Hyperlink button at the bottom of the Hyperlinks panel.

3. In the New Hyperlink dialog box, choose Shared Destination from the '\\Link To\\' menu.




4. For Document, select the document containing the destination that a user wants to jump to. All open documents that have been saved are listed in the pop-up menu. If the document which a user is looking for is not open, select Browse in the pop-up menu, locate the file, and then click Open.

5. Choose a destination from the Name menu.

6. Specify hyperlink appearance options, and then click OK. Answer: D is incorrect. Specify the Page option in the '\\Link To\\' menu to create a hyperlink destination to a Page.

To create a hyperlink to a page take the following steps:

1. Select the text, frame, or graphic you want to be the source of the hyperlink.
2. Choose New Hyperlink in the Hyperlinks panel menu, or click the Create New Hyperlink button at the bottom of the Hyperlinks panel.
3. In the New Hyperlink dialog box, choose Page from the '\\Link To\\' menu.



4. For Document, select the document containing the destination that a user wants to jump to. All open documents that have been saved are listed in the pop-up menu. If the document which a user is looking for not open, select Browse in the pop-up menu, locate the file, and then click Open.

5. For Page, specify the page number a user wants to jump to.

6. For Zoom Setting, do one of the following to select the view state of the page being jumped to: Select Fixed to display the magnification level and page position that were in effect when the link is created.

Select Fit View to display the visible portion of the current page as the destination. Select Fit In Window to display the current page in the destination window. Select Fit Width or Fit Height to display the width or height of the current page in the destination window.

Select Fit Visible to display the page so that its text and graphics fit the width of the window, which usually means that the margins are not displayed. Select Inherit Zoom to display the destination window at the magnification level the

reader uses when the hyperlink is clicked.

7. Specify appearance options, and then click OK.

## QUESTION 8

Andy works as a Web developer for company Inc. He has created a Web page using InDesign CS5 with an extensive amount of information. He wants to use links for the convenience of the users of his Website so that they can directly

get to a particular section on the current Web page.

Which of the following panels will Andy use to accomplish this task?

Correct Answer: D

The Hyperlinks panel is a feature of InDesign CS5 which is used to create hyperlinks in a document so that when a user exports to Adobe PDF or SWF in InDesign, a viewer can click a link to jump to other locations in the same document, to other documents, or to websites. To open the Hyperlinks panel in InDesign CS5, use one of the following steps: Choose Window > Interactive > Hyperlinks. Choose Window > Type and Tables > Cross-References.




Answer option A is incorrect. The Links panel is a feature of InDesign where all the files are listed and placed in a document. These include both local (on disk) files and assets that are managed on a server. However, the files that are pasted from a website in Internet Explorer are not displayed in this panel. The Links panel is shown in the image below:




Answer option B is incorrect. The Pages panel is used in InDesign to work with document pages as well as master pages. It allows a user to create pages,

which can be blank pages or based on a master page. These pages can be moved, copied, and deleted, as well as for retrospectively applying a master. The Pages panel also provides an excellent method to navigate through longer documents. To open the Pages panel, choose **Window > Pages**, or press **Control+F12** on the keyboard. The Pages panel is shown in the image below:



Answer option C is incorrect. The Preflight panel is a feature of InDesign CS5 that warns of the problems that could prevent a document or book from printing or outputting as expected while a document is being edited. These problems include missing files or fonts, low-resolution images, overset text, and a number of other conditions.

The preflight settings can be configured to define which conditions are detected. These preflight settings are stored in preflight profiles for easy reuse. To open the Preflight panel, choose **Window > Output > Preflight**, and double-click the Preflight icon at the bottom of the document window. The Preflight icon is green if no errors are detected or red if errors are detected. The Preflight panel is shown in the image below:

Answer: A is incorrect. The Sort Entries in Alphabetical Order option is selected to sort table of contents entries in the selected style alphabetically.

Answer: C is incorrect. The Between Entry And Number option should be selected to specify which characters you want between the table of contents entry and its page number.

Answer: B is incorrect. The Create PDF Bookmarks option should be selected if you want the table of contents entries to appear in the Bookmarks panel of Adobe Acrobat or Adobe Reader when the document is exported to PDF.

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#### QUESTION 10

Which of the following can you check by using the Separations Preview panel? Each correct answer represents a complete solution. Choose all that apply.

Correct Answer: ABCD

You can check the following areas by using the Separations Preview panel: Varnishes and other coatings. Since varnishes are transparent, they can be difficult to preview on a screen. When a user previews a varnish separation by himself, the varnished areas appear in black. Rich black. Previewing separation allows a user to identify areas that will print as rich black, or process black (K) ink mixed with color inks for increased opacity and richer colors. Ink coverage Too much of ink on the paper can cause drying problems. Overprinting. Previewing this will allow a user to see how blending, transparency, and overprinting will appear in a color-separated output.

### QUESTION 12

Which of the following options is NOT included in Marks and Bleed area pane of the print dialog box?

- A. Color Bars
- B. Crop Marks
- C. Spreads
- D. Registration Marks

Correct Answer: C

This option is included in the General pane of the Print dialog box. Selecting this option prints facing pages on the same sheet of paper.

Answer: B is incorrect. It adds fine (hairline) horizontal and vertical rules that define where the page should be trimmed. Crop marks can also help register (align) one color separation to another.

Answer: D is incorrect. It adds small "targets" outside the page area for aligning the different separations in a color document.

Answer: A is incorrect. It adds small squares of color representing the CMYK inks and tints of gray. Your service provider uses these marks to adjust ink density on the printing press.

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### QUESTION 13

You are creating a document in InDesign CS5. You choose Optimized Original Images or Optimized Formatted Images in the Images tab of the Export XML dialog box.

Which of the following options will you choose to specify which file format to use for the converted image?

Correct Answer: C

The Image Conversion option specifies which file format to use for the converted image. If you choose Automatic, InDesign chooses the best file type based on the image. Further, you may also want to specify both GIF and JPEG Options.

Answer: B is incorrect. GIF Options specify the formatting for images that are converted into the GIF format when exported to XML. Answer: A is incorrect. JPEG Options specify the formatting for images that are converted into the JPEG format when exported to XML. Answer: D is incorrect. There is no such option in the Images tab of the Export XML dialog box.

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#### QUESTION 14

You are a regular user of InDesign CS5. You want to locate any imported color bitmapped image with an effective resolution of less than 260 ppi. What will you do to accomplish this task?

- A. Using the Preflight panel, edit the Basic profile using a Color Image Minimum Resolution setting of 260 ppi.
- B. Using the Preflight panel, create a new Preflight profile with a Color Image Minimum Resolution setting of 260 ppi.

Correct Answer: B

To locate any imported color bitmapped image with an effective resolution of less than 260 ppi, you will create a new Preflight profile with a Color Image Minimum Resolution setting of 260 ppi in the Preflight panel.

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#### QUESTION 15

You work as a Design Expert for KBC Inc. You have created an artwork that is restricted to two Pantone spot colors. When it got printed, you noticed that there are some objects using Cyan and Magenta colors in your document.

How can you detect these objects before printing?

- A. Choose Window > Output > Flattener Preview panel.
- B. Click on the info icon in the Preflight panel.
- C. Select the Overprint Preview checkbox in the Separations Preview panel, then turn off visibility for the Pantone colors.

Correct Answer: C


The Separations Preview panel is used to preview color separations on monitor before printing to avoid unexpected spot colors and unwanted overprinting. The Separations Preview panel allows a user to easily turn colors on and off so that it can be seen how blending, transparency, and overprinting will appear in color separated output. The Separations Preview panel can be displayed by choosing Window > Out put > Separations Preview or pressing Shift+F6.

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
Separations Preview panel

You can hide or view a separation ink on the screen by clicking the eye icon in the left of the separation name. To hide or view all separation inks on screen except one, press Alt and click the eye icon for that separation. To view all process plates at once, click the CMYK icon. The normal view can be returned by deselecting the Overprint Preview. Answer: D is incorrect. The Swatches panel stores colors. It is used to import, export, delete, and modify the color palette. Besides, a user can store custom colors in the Swatches panel. To add a color in the Swatches panel, move the cursor to the empty area of the Swatches panel (the cursor will change into the paint bucket) and click. To access the Swatches panel, select Window > Swatches. Answer: B is incorrect. The Preflight panel is a feature of InDesign CS5 that warns of the problems that could prevent a document or book from printing or outputting as expected while a document is being edited. These problems include missing files or fonts, low-resolution images, overset text, and a number of other conditions. The preflight settings can be configured to define which conditions are detected. These preflight settings are stored in preflight profiles for easy reuse. To open the Preflight panel, choose Window > Output > Preflight, and double-click the Preflight icon at the bottom of the document window. The Preflight icon is green if no errors are detected or red if errors are detected. The Preflight panel is shown in the image below.



Answer: A is incorrect. The Flattener Preview panel is used to see what page items (typically those with transparency) are flattened (made solid) during printing or exporting to Encapsulated PostScript (EPS), Scalable Vector Graphics (SVG, a vector format for the Web), or Portable Document Format (PDF) format. Flattening occurs for printing devices and graphics export formats that do not support transparency. To open the Flattener Preview panel, Choose Window >

Output > Flattener.
